Program Components



- Education: in partnership with John Muir Charter School (JMCS), offers High School Diploma completion through direct instruction, credit recovery, tutoring, and study-skills training
- Occupational Training: in partnership with Sonoma County Office of Education (SCOE), offers off-site Occupational Training including nationally recognized NCCER certification
- <u>Truancy Prevention</u>: in partnership with Santa Rosa City Schools, a specialist offers truancy prevention support to middle and high school students
- <u>Leadership Development</u>: numerous opportunities within the program, such as our Leadership Committee that creates Program Policies & Procedures, assists in hiring staff, and participates in community outreach
- Work Readiness Certification: in partnership with SCOE, Youth Connections staff is trained in delivering the Work Readiness Certification

Program Components



- <u>Case Management</u>: proactive philosophy in supporting youth in overcoming life barriers and maintaining a strong referral system
- Community Engagement: ongoing community-based service learning projects that are linked to classroom instruction
- Workforce Preparation Activities: support youth attain job shadows, internships, networking and workforce opportunities
- <u>Post-Secondary Education Exploration</u>: staff from various postsecondary institutions speak to our youth about enrollment, financial aid, counseling, and host campus visits
- Mentoring: community members are matched to mentor our youth to serve as an additional source of support
- Post-Program Follow-up: program completers are tracked to continue support in employment and post-secondary fields

On-site Workshops



- Career Exploration: on-site monthly workshops creating e-portfolios through Kuder Navigator and off-site trips to various employers
- <u>Health Services & Prevention</u>: on-site monthly sex education & overall preventative workshops
- <u>Healthy Behaviors</u>: on-site monthly workshops on nutrition, physical fitness, and leading a healthy lifestyle
- Financial Literacy: on-site semi-annual workshops in money management and financial education
- Parenting Development Classes: on-site parenting workshops for our youth that are parenting their own children
- Substance Abuse Support: on-site monthly group sessions and confidential individual meetings

Program Highlights



- Opened our doors on August 27th, 2012 at the South Park Youth Center
- Enrollment of 25 youth out of the targeted 25, averaging 19.62 Monthly Attendance since January 2013
- Successful transition from YouthBuild Santa Rosa to Youth Connections, offering MORE programmatic services per youth
- Aligns with the Cradle to Career Initiative
- Since opening, students average 1.3 credits per week with 1.0 being the program standard
- Developing a 20-workshop Mexican-American Art History
 Project in collaboration with a Sonoma State University
 Lecturer, which ends with students delivering curriculum to local elementary and middle schools

Program Highlights



- •In collaboration with the Imaginists, students will work in and around their upcoming performance, How a Mountain Was Made, written by Greg Sarris.
- •A scholarship fund was created for Youth Connections Graduates called Oscar's Scholars, in honor of our former Executive Director, Oscar Chavez
- •A student was hired to maintain the South Park Community Garden that also delivers workshops to Community Action's After School Program students in grades K-8th
- •Our John Muir Teacher received Level 4 Triple P Accreditation and delivers parenting workshops alongside our California Parenting Institute Co-located Staff

Desired Program Outcomes



- Youth are prepared for post-secondary educational opportunities, including advanced training or occupational skills training
- Youth are prepared for employment, including entering the workforce and continuing their career development
- Youth continue their leadership and self-advocacy development by maintaining strong ties to our community.
- Out-of-School youth learn the value of academic and occupational learning and achieve gains in functioning levels.
- Disadvantaged young adults in Sonoma County complete postsecondary occupational training, overcome barriers to social and economic stability and secure FT living wage employment
